Senator Horsford Unveils SB 330: The Initiative for a World-Class Education

Senate Bill 330 (SB 330) was introduced in Carson City by Senator Steven Horsford, Wednesday, March 18. SB 330, as defined by Sen. Horsford, is a bill that provides “an opportunity to have a debate about the state of our education and how to implement sensible solutions that improve student achievement. It is a proposal that allows us to take bold action based on the concern of parents, teachers, and the business leaders among others who are concerned about the state of education in Nevada. It is a policy discussion on education.”

NSEA is taking part in the open conversation as well as part of the group working together to ensure all Nevada students have a world-class education.

The bill seeks to find a financial solution that would increase per-pupil spending from close to 50th in the nation to a much more acceptable ranking. The bill, as presented, will be re-worked and amended to ensure the final product is acceptable for our members.
